The school employs a full-time cook who prepares healthy, tasty and nutritional food for the young learners. They are served hot meals first and second break. In Winter it is a real blessing.

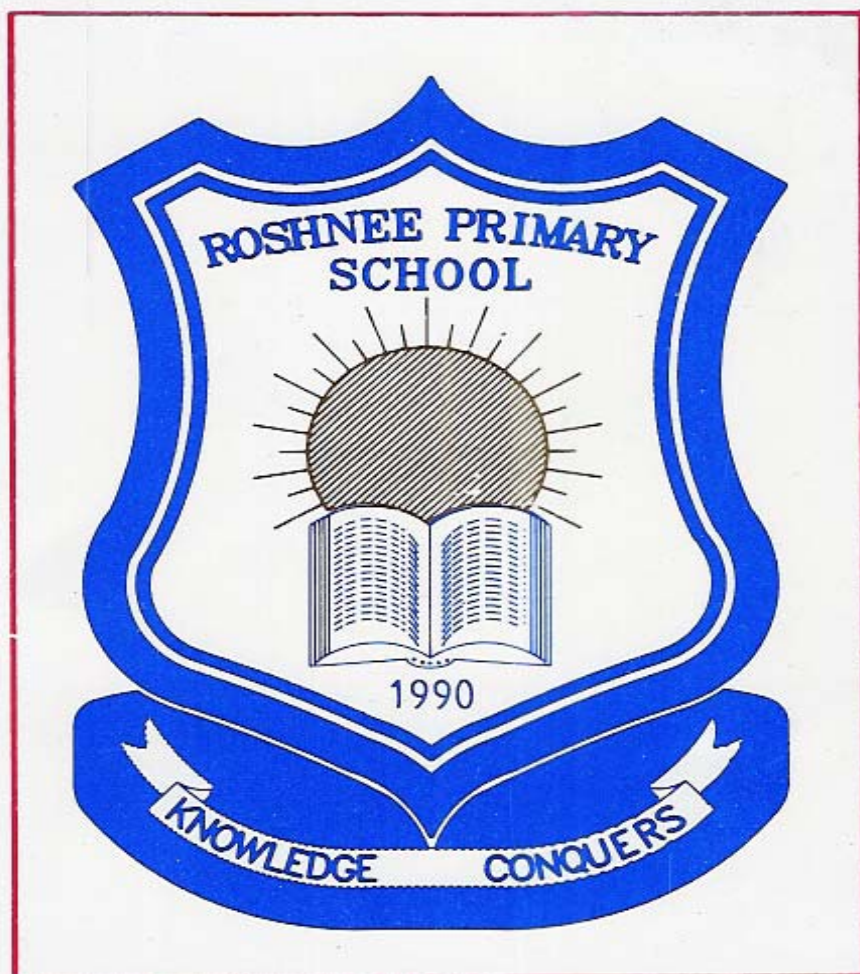
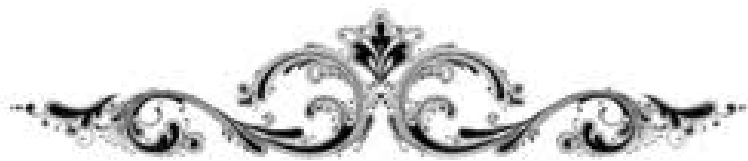
The Education Department provides ingredients for the meals, fresh fruit and vegetables as well some form of protein so that the learners receive fully balanced meals and sandwiches.

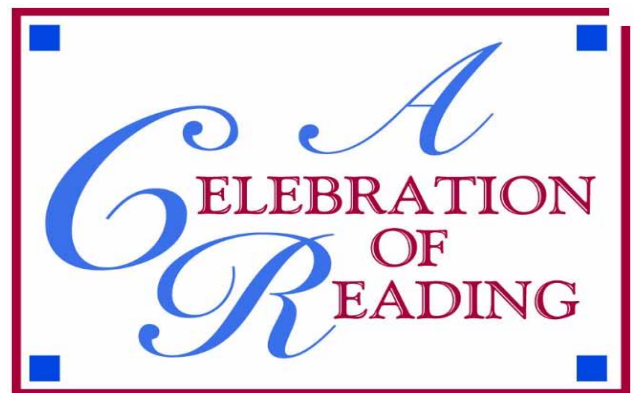

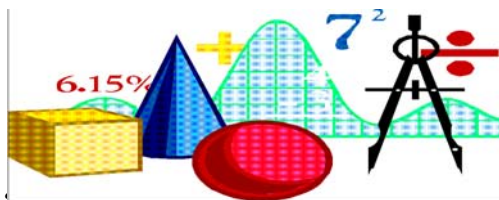
Visiting the Sci-Bono Discovery Centre
